Safety Article

What to do in the Winter

Beside turning up the heat.



The winter season began in December 2022 and will chilly continues through February 2023. As indicated by NOAA's September forecast, our area will see wetter-than-average conditions across the upper latitudes of the United States. In addition, New York State may have above-average snow, but NYC may be spared depending on how the wind blows.

AccuWeather sees a strong possibility that New York (including Long Island) may experience fewer inches of snowfall than usual. "Residents across the Northeast and Midwest will experience a few winter previews in November and December as waves of cold air dive down from Canada, but the biggest blasts of cold air will hold off until later in the winter," reported AccuWeather.

According to *The 2023 Old Farmer's Almanac*, the area along the East Coast is best described as being "Shivery & Snowy." The Almanac concludes that winter temperatures will be colder and snowfall will be greater. In fact, the eastern half of the U.S. should brace for potentially record-breaking cold. This frigid forecast extends to the Deep South as far south as Texas.

The predictors all seem to agree it may be cold this winter, and with home heating fuel oil predicted to rise and hit \$6.00 a gallon, most of us who may be thinking of raising the temperature on the thermostat may think twice before touching the dial. These colder days don't mean we can't think about boating. After all, there is a lot to do before the 2023 boating season begins. And thinking of boating does warm the heart!

Check your charts. Local authorities may pull aids to navigation like channel markers and buoys as early as October in some areas. But NOAA has charts on demand. Now is an excellent time to make sure your paper and electronic charts are up to date so you can use them as soon as the boat goes in the water.

Check fire extinguishers and flares. Be prepared for your Spring Vessel Safety Check by checking these essential safety items. Inspect your fire extinguishers. Look for rust around the rim and check if they read Green. Check your emergency flares haven't expired, either. Watch for sales, purchase a few waterproof flashlights, and stock spare bulbs and batteries.

Member Article New Year's Resolutions by P/C Ann

Looking out the window at the remaining birds desperately looking for food in the yard, I thought: "Did one of these guys make a resolution: "Next year, we're leaving for Florida earlier!" The tradition of making a New Year's resolution was common in past years, where young and old resolved to make

good choices, change an undesired trait or behavior, or perhaps, accomplish a personal goal within the new year. Making resolutions is seen as an old adage from the distant past. Younger (I mean less than 40ish) don't participate in this one-time tried and true way of improving oneself.

As far back as Roman times, an individual made pledges to the god Janus each year. Janus was the god of the beginning and the end. Since Janus represented the beginning and the end, this deity represents moving actions that lead Romans to believe they had as an opportunity to start each year anew with Janus' help. Thus **January** becomes the beginning. The tradition of Resolutions is recorded equally in Judaism's New Year, Rosh Hashanah, that end with Yom Kippur (the Day of Atonement). Christians also seek to improve themselves and similarly atone or make amends for wrongdoings in the liturgical season of Lent followed by a renewal or rebirth with Easter

However, Current statistics for 2022 showed that only 23% (of those sampled) plan to make New Year's resolutions. And more unfortunately, 91% of all resolutions made - fail. Most people blamed 'Resolution Failure' on a lack of time, resources, motivation, or a loss of zeal after starting. Research also showed that there many common resolutions.

Exercise more ■ Lose weight ■ Get organized ■ Quit smoking ■ Spend more time with family and friends. ■ Don't put off things until a later time ② Save more money.
 Of course, as a boater, the last two were of interest to me. Putting off winter tasks and saving money are two critical resolutions.

Neglecting to do proper maintenance could be a danger to you and your crew. Putting off until later and forgetting to perform routine winter maintenance may cost you a ton of money. Knowing what to do is essential. Check your boat's Maintenance Guide. If you don't have one, checking with the manufacturer or a simple Google may be the answer to obtaining this custom care checklist for your boat.

Another "Put Off" is Taking a boater-education course. If you're new to boating, the best gift you can give yourself this winter is a boater's-ed class. Consider taking a Seminar which are free at our Club, or take an Advanced Course which are worth their weight in gold. Even if you've been boating since you were a kid, refresh lost memories with topics like *Rules of the Water, What to do in an Emergency*. You might just earn your SN as you travel up the USPS educational ladder.

So if you make a resolution this year, I hope it is to advance your boater educational knowledge. Contact our Education Team that always resolves to have the programs you need and want to be a more competent boater.

Check life jacket. Pull out the Life Jackets. Make sure they are all wearables. No tears, rips, and straps are in good condition. Also, check with Club members if you would like to exchange a few LIFE JACKETS with other Club members. Now is an excellent time to <u>Place an Ad</u> in the <u>OB Gull Chatter</u>. It's free! Look over your boat supplies; you just may have an item or two that need to be re-gifted to another boater, or you may want to make a 'marine swap.'

Check the App. Today's boaters are using apps on their smartphones to find up-to-the-minute information, including, weather, tide and navigation information. One app can place a help call with a swipe of a finger. The best time to learn the ins and outs of these apps is sitting by a warm fire at home.

Checklist for Emergencies. All boaters should know what they would do in an emergency. Plan some "mental boat drills.' The first step to a successful 'on-the-water drill' is to know what has to be accomplished. Of course, an actual on-the-water practice drills is best, but if you don't have a mental plan of action, your drill will surely be unsuccessful. Write or search on the internet for step-by-step instructions concerning potential emergencies. Knowing what to do will help you plan your on-the-water practice sessions when your crew and guest arrive in the spring. As my friend, Dan Fannon from Bayside PS would say, "Although practice may not make perfect, holding regular onboard safety boating drills makes it more likely that you will handle emergencies calmly and with authority."



Check out your next Cruise. Plan big! After all, it's your winter dream. You can make it as grand as you'd like. Think about the places you would like to visit in 2023. Check out books, magazines, and the internet for next year's adventure. You may wonder do I have all the information for a successful journey.
