The **Blessing of the Fleet** on June 2nd was met with good weather. About **20** vessels participated were blessed by **5** members of the clergy of various denominations from Oyster Bay. Thanks to all those who assisted Larry Weiss, chairperson of the Blessing, to reinstate this boating community event.

Vessel Safety Checks are conducted either by appointment, examiners walking the dock or boat ramp offering VSCs. Or, you can pre-arranged a VS Check. On June 9th, our vessel examiners provided prearranged exams to Tappan Beach Marina & Hempstead Harbor Yacht Club. Vessel Safety Checks were also done at Saga-

more Yacht Club on June 22nd. Our squadron now has 4 certified Vessel Examiners and, to date, has performed 22 safety checks. Vessel Examiners are available through the boating season just email me at <u>ronnfer@yahoo.com</u> to schedule a Vessel Safety Check.to arrange an appointment.

Coop charting will get underway in mid-July and continue over the next 6-week period to give the captains who volunteer time to fit their schedule. We typically cover *Hempstead Harbor*, *Oyster Bay*, *Oyster Bay Harbor*, *Huntington Bay*, *Huntington Harbor*, *Centerport and Northport Harbors*. Since 2006-2007, our squadron has won the District 3 Coop Charting award 9 times. Last year we ranked number 8 nationwide. Captains who wish to participate, and anyone who wishes to join us on the boats, please email me. Let me know what area you can cover and an approximate time frame you have available. Captains: let me know if you will need crew.

Do you prefer a land-based activity? Before GPS and laser surveying instrument, **geodetic markers** were used for reference points for surveying the land. These markers are still in use as reference and maintained by the National Geodetic Survey (NGS). Locating them in your community and reporting their condition is a great activity. You can enjoy getting out, getting some exercise and getting in touch with our local history. Maps of the locations of the markers in your area are available on the internet. Go to www.ngs.noaa.gov/datasheets/.

Providing **seminars to local yacht clubs**, falls under two flags of the bridge. Obviously, under the Education Officer and the Executive Officer as it is a service to an external organization. Tom Peltier and I have been approached by Hempstead Harbor Yacht Club to provide a *Man Overboard* seminar to their membership. After two recent incidents, this topic has risen to the forefront of their bridge. Two of our members, also yacht club members, recommended the Oyster Bay Sail & Power Squadron as potential educator for their club's members. We will present our *Man Overboard* seminar on July 15th. Hopefully, this will lead the way for us to provide other educational opportunities and be their "go to" for safe boating education.

Admin Report

Price, Perception and Paradigm

I hope everyone's boating season has gotten off to a wonderful start! 2017 new boat sales data indicates that new boat sales have gone up 4.7 percent from 2016, and a whopping 141.6 million Americans, adults and children, went boating in 2016. This should herald great news for the US Power Squadrons - America's Boating Club® with new students for the America's Boating Course and potentially new membership. However, while these numbers are promising, Millennials, while they participate in boating in the same rates as their parents they are far less likely to own a boat. This change in trend has long term ramifications for the



Club and the small water craft industry as well. We are aware that there are promising solutions, but to keep our hobby alive for future generations, we need to know what hurdles are keeping people from owning a boating: Price, Perception and Paradigm shift in ownership.

Price

Both Forbes and Times magazine have reported that younger adults earn less and as a result conventional boat ownership would seem like a pipe dream, however for frugal Millennials they can pursue trailerable boats to avoid mooring and storage costs and for sailing, those with tight budgets can consider older fiberglass hulls or "classic plastics." This is where our club can help first time boaters with finding and evaluating used boats and possibly advise or perhaps coordinate on a local and national level with lenders to help with financing options.

Perception

Another big obstacle for young people to get involved with boating beyond cost is familiarity. For most people investing in a big ticket item is daunting and even more so when there isn't any familiarity on how stuff works. With nearly 75% of Millennials not knowing how to change a flat tire the prospect of owning a boat and then having to fix something that's broken on the water is even more daunting. The unpredictability of this unknown is sometimes even more challenging than the financial burden. This is where our members can help potential boat owners by letting them know about on the water services that can help with emergencies should they arise.

Paradigm Shift

The sharing economy is becoming more popular among young adults so inevitably there will be a decline in conventional ownership. There has been a 51% increase in boat charters since 2015 according to a Bareboat Charter Industry study. Chartering is fun and easy on demand boating but doesn't build community, nor does it necessarily foster safe boating habits. To help keep the recreational boating community thriving into the future, we can assist young boaters by perhaps offering to be a conduit for shared boat ownership. Anchors Aweigh!

favorites.






SAFETY Report

"Be in the Know before you Go!"

No matter how much boating experience you have, it's always a good idea to review basic boat safety tips. Think about it, not one professional athlete, entertainer or teacher, would consider heading out to perform without first practicing, reviewing, or updating their skills sets. Well, boaters should think like pros. A safe and comfortable voyage requires the captain and the crew to be know that they are prepared for anything. I jotted down a couple of basic safety tips to think about, so you can 'be in the know before you go.'

Be Weather-Wise! Always check the weather conditions before departing. There are many ways to find up-to-date weather information. Today's TV and Radio Forecasts tend to be pretty accurate. Smart phone APPs can provide to-the-minute area information. Wx Channel, on your Marine Radio, loops up-to-date weather information. But sometimes all you have to do is look up! If you notice dark clouds approaching, chang-



Check it Twice List! Proper boating safety includes being prepared for any possibility on the water. Develop a Pre-Departure Checklist and make sure to include items that are frequently forgotten: Fresh Water, Snacks, Flashlight w/extra batteries and bulbs,

Charts and Extra Line. Of course, you should have a "Will it Work When I Need It To List." This list should include items like – Radio (both Marine & FM/AM), Handheld GPS, Fire Extinguishers, Fully charged Boat Batteries, Inflatable Life Jackets, Navigational Lights and such.

Think about the Common Sense Approach! One of the most important parts of boating safely is to use your common sense. This means operating your boat at a safe speed at all times, especially in crowded and confined areas. Stay alert and assign a Lookout for small crafts, divers, swimmers and vessels with restrictive mobility. Being right may be great but it doesn't make common sense when the Give-Way ocean liner heading for you.

To Know is to Know! Always have a general idea where you'll be sailing or cruising even if it's only an afternoon excursion. Plan *the* course, use your Charts and GPS and review where possible danger or problem areas may arise. Knowing 'the course like the back of your hand' is great, but if you are forced to deviate from your 'back of hand course' you may wind up stranded aground unexpectedly. So be prepared with up to date charts which you can download free from NOAA.

Plan with a Float Plan! I've had many experienced boaters tell me, "I could sail these waters with my eyes closed. Everything will be fine!" But that one time you're out on the water, with no one in sight, your radio dead, you might just think..."I wish I had told someone where I was going and when I was returning to port." In fact, it's easier than ever to file a Float Plan. You can download the Coast Guard Mobile APP – on your smart phone. It has a Float Plan built in and some other great features like: a list of safety regulations, Navigational Rules, Nearest NOAA buoy, Reporting of hazards or suspicious activities, as well as, requesting emergency assistance.

One-for-One! Of course don't leave home without 1 life jacket for each person on board. Did you know that the majority of drowning victims are the result of boaters NOT wearing their lifejackets? Make sure



that your family, friends and crewmates are not part of *that* statistic. Not only have Life Jackets on board, but encourage everyone, including the captain, to wear their Life Jackets at all times. Today's Life Jackets are becoming more comfortable and they could save your life.

So experienced or novice, it's always a good idea to review those basic boat safety tips you learned in the America's Boating Course. Perhaps, think about taking a more advanced course: Boat Handling, Piloting or Advanced Piloting. Consider the many Seminars available from USPS. Contact our Educational Officer – Thomas- to arrange a seminar that you think would be interesting. Having a safe and comfortable voyage requires being prepared and by practicing, reviewing, or updating potential lifesaving skills sets. Be a Pro – Make sure your Know!

The Vessel Safety Check Program was developed to serve the recreational boating public. The Oyster Bay Sail and Power Squadron is proud to announce that our Vessel Safety Examiners are always ready to help you know about your boat and how to keep it safe. Whether on the hard or in the water, give them a call. It's FREE and examiners! They will only recommend equipment you need to help keep you and your crew safe. After a successful exam, our examiners are happy to present you with a decal which is attached to the boat.

If you fail the Safety Check List this is a perfect time to discuss the non-complying issues with your examiner. He/She would be happy to help you correct any problems including suggestions about necessary repairs or replacement items that keep you safe. A follow-up exam will be scheduled to ensure your vessel will be in compliance for 2018. Since the USPS is *not a law enforcement* agency and reports are not shared with anyone outside our organization, boat owners feel a sense of confidence.
