




Safety Article

I just heard on the news that the tide will be very high this weekend. Which started me thinking about the Rule of Twelfths. I know, you're saying "You started to think about...WHAT?" But it's true! My mind works in many strange ways...as you know. Anyway, I did a quick search and found a great article I had saved in my personal library from BoatUS by Mel Neale from 2016 that refreshed my memory about *12ths* and I'd like to share it with you.

Basically, the tide tables tell you 3 very important facts: time of high tide, time of low tide and the heights of each. To apply the 'Rules of Twelfths' you can divide by 12. It kind of looks like this chart on the right.

So, why is this important you ask? If you're planning a summer cruise you may need to know just how much water is



below your boat at any specific time of day and at a specific location. To learn more, access the tide tables, the "Rule of Twelfths" to get the answer. This easy-to-use guide for "semi-diurnal" tides, which means there are two nearly identical complete tidal cycles a day (high, low, high, low, all within approximately 24 hours) will help you stay out of trouble.

The basic rules states that it takes about 6 hours for a tide to complete its rise (flood) and its fall (ebb). The "slack" period (when the tide is reversing directions) may vary depending upon your location and other factors, like moon, wind, etc. Slack tide was important to me because, I was not particularly fond of the rock-n-rollin' going through the Plum Gut out east.

You can find the NOAA tide tables for free at https://tidesandcurrents.noaa.gov/ tide predictions.html. This animated table is up to the minute information. In fact, you can change the date for up to 31 days forward which is great for planning trips. There is so much information available at that website to maintain a "safe and comfortable" voyage.

For fun, plan a hypothetical cruise up the Connecticut River or someplace you plan to visit this summer. Don't forget start with your chart, also available online for free, to create your journey. Let me know how your hypothetical cruise turned out. It may be winter now, but Summer Cruises are just around the corner and now seems a perfect time to learn the "Rule of Twelfths."

The Tail that Wags the Dog. I-911 Technology trickles down hill! By Cdr Ron Ferina, JN

Most of the electronic devices on your boat are descendants of military and/or commercial maritime technology developed for defense or commercial needs. For example, your depth sounder/fish finder trickled down from sonar which was **developed** during World War I to counter the growing threat of submarine warfare. Shipboard Ioran, radar, GPS, AIS, VHF radio, satellite phones, EPERBs and PLBs: all *trickle down technologies*. These common, everyday items, have become commonplace on our vessels as the cost for the technology drops and technology advances for the military leaving us with the remnants of "obsolescence".

I have been an instructor for the Power Squadrons for well over 10 years, and when VHF radio and cell phone use come up, we (instructors) always encourage VHF radio over cell phone use in an emergency and for good reason.

- 1- A VHF broadcast reaches more rescue-capable agencies at one time than a cell phone
- 2– Vessels in your vicinity hear your distress call simultaneously (other recreational vessels are likely to be "on scene" to assist before government agencies)
- 3- Immediate communication with the Coast Guard
- 4— Calling the Coast Guard's general number with a cell phone gets you to a call center (we all should be able to relate to that: press 1 if you agree: press 2 if you disagree ...)
- 5— Dialing 911 gets you to a land-based dispatcher that needs to relay your call, or worse, relay your information about your situation that they most likely will not understand. ("Help...I am 2 miles north of Oak Neck Point" or "...at Latitude blah-blah, Longitude blah-blah")

BUT wait a minute!! Recently, the Coast Guard has embraced the lowly Smart Phone! Did the technology, built for the consumer market, break the "Not Invented Here" syndrome? **It certainly did!**

The U.S.Coast Guard recently completed beta trials this last year in U.S.C.G. Sector One (The N.E. including Long Island Sound and rolled out their "i-911" program to minimize the "search" in Rescue operations of recreational boaters in trouble. The GPS built into your cell phone can track you…if you allow someone to access it. The Coast Guard can too, but they need your permission.

So, you are in trouble and need help. You dial "i-911" which immediately is picked up by the Coast Guard's Rescue 21 system. The incoming call displays your cell number. The Coast Guard texts you to get your permission to track you with your cell phone. You reply "yes' and within seconds, they can track you (actually your phone) in real time, within 30 feet of your location. They have just eliminated the "Search" in "Search and Rescue".

A few caveats, however:

- 1– Your phone must be set to allow location service to be on
- 2- You need to be within 15 miles of a cell tower (20 miles in some cases)



If you contacted the Coast Guard by VHF radio, which is still the very much the preferred method, they may ask to track you by using your cell phone — just dial i-911.

Social Distancing can't keep us apart - we continue to work for a safer, healthier boating world.
